Arthropodium purpureum cirratum <i>Renga Renga Lily</i>	Dwarf Renga Renga lily, good as ground cover or in a pot. Bronzy/purple foliage. Tiny white star like flowers through summer. Astelia banksii <i>Shore Astelia</i>	Lovely, low maintenance choice of plant well suited to coastal gardens. Narrow silvery flax-like leaves, creamy flower spike followed by black berries. Good for riparian planting. Tolerant of moderate frost, otherwise very hardy. 1.2 x 1.2m.	2.5L	\$12.00
Astelia chathamica 'Silver Shadow'	Striking silver foliage making this a great impact/contrast plant. Tolerant of a range of sites as long as well drained. Evergreen. 1 x 1.2m.	2.5L	\$12.00

Beilschmedia tarairi <i>Taraire</i>	Brilliant, under utilized native tree. Taraire has large leathery looking leaves which have a red tinge. Makes a great canopy tree. Berries are dark purple and are favorites to wood pigeons. It will only tolerate a light frost, and is best provided with a wind break when young. Prefers a good moist, free draining soil. Beilschmedia 'Tawa' <i>Tawa</i>	Tall canopy tree, native to the North Island and NE corner of the South Island. In the forest it will grow to 25m but in the garden it will grow to around 8-10m.
